What is a Math Circle?

A Math Circle is a group of people who get together to do fun, unusual math problems outside of regular school.

Why join a Math Circle?

Who can join a Math Circle of Chicago?

Any student in grades 5-12; we have different classes grouped by grade level.

Where and when do the Math Circles of Chicago meet?

Math Circles meet at five locations around Chicago. Each program typically meets twice a month during the school year. Dates here are for the first day of our fall sessions:

- **Bridgeport at Benton House: Grades 6-8, Tuesdays, 5:30-6:45PM, October 4th**
- **Lane Tech High School: Grades 5-8, Tuesdays, 5:00-6:15PM, September 27th**
- **Payton High School: Grades 5-12, Saturdays, 1:00-3:00PM, September 24th**
- **Pilsen at Mujeres Latinas en Accion Youth Center, Grades 6-12, Mondays, 4:30-6:00PM for 6th to 8th, 5:00-6:45PM, 9th to 12th, September 12th**
- **University of Chicago, Ryerson Hall, Grades 7-12, Saturdays, 1PM-3PM, October 1st**

How do I sign up?
